Regular Briefing of Central Disaster and Safety Countermeasure Headquarters on COVID-19

- ▲Measures to enhance infection prevention and control of entrants from abroad and its current status, and
▲current status regarding supply and demand of masks, and etc. -

- The Central Disaster and Safety Countermeasure Headquarters held a meeting today presided over by Head Chung Sekyun (Prime Minister) along with the central government and 17 cities and provinces to discuss ▲measures to enhance infection prevention and control of entrants from abroad and its current status, and ▲current status regarding supply and demand of masks, and etc. at the Central Disaster and Safety Management Center in Government Complex Seoul.
- Head Chung emphasized, at the meeting, that as we are approaching the second week of the enhanced social distancing, the central and local governments should work together to achieve meaningful outcomes.

- At a time when cases are increasingly imported from other countries, he urged **the relevant ministries to put more efforts** to make sure **the self-quarantine protection app functions well.**
- Pointing out some are **faced with the lack of thermometers**, he called for **resolving inconveniences of the public** by **better managing stocks and providing them first** to those who essentially need them.
- The Prime Minister also directed the relevant ministries including the Ministry of Food and Drug Safety to **review supply and demand of antiseptic ethanol and develop countermeasures.**

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Measures to enhance infection prevention and control of entrants from abroad and its current status


- The Central Disaster and Safety Countermeasure Headquarters starts to **apply the enhanced infection prevention and control measures to entrants arriving from abroad from 00:00, April 1.**
- Currently, only arrivals from Europe and the United States are self-isolated, but **going forward, all Koreans and foreign nationals arriving from all parts of the world will go into self-quarantine**, in principle, **for 14 days upon entry.** This measure came **to prevent infection factors from being imported from other countries** amid COVID-19 spreading globally at a rapid pace.
- Also, **those entering the nation for short-term stay** who used to be under active surveillance without any isolation should **go into self-quarantine in principle, except for some exceptional cases.**

- In particular, given that short-term visitors do not have a fixed residence suitable for self-isolation, they are allowed **to use isolation facilities** prepared by the government so that every quarantine subject can go into self-quarantine. In that case, **expenses incurred from using such facilities will be collected** from users.
- The government **supports the expenses of diagnostic tests and treatment for overseas entrants**. Such support is **for public interest to block the spread of infection**, not a benefit. However, **living support expenses are not provided** considering that **the entry to Korea is a personal choice** and concerned voices were raised that providing living expenses might induce more overseas entrants.
- If people coming from abroad **do not comply with quarantine rules**, they can **be punished by imprisonment for no more than 1 year or by a fine not exceeding KRW 10 million** (to be effective from Apr. 5) on the ground of violating the quarantine act, and the infectious disease control and prevention act*. Foreign violators can be subject to **deportation, prohibition of entry**, and others in accordance with the immigration act**. So all entrants should **thoroughly abide by the rules**.

- Plus, the Central Disaster and Safety Countermeasure Headquarters was reported and reviewed the current status of managing overseas entrants by Incheon Metropolitan City.
- In consideration of proximity and geographical location of Incheon Airport, the city is expanding the diagnostic tests for COVID-19 on more overseas arrivals through separate guides, and has them undergo the tests at screening clinics in the process of being transported to homes for self-quarantine.

2 Progress of financial support for small businesses

- The government announced the current status of guarantees supported to small businesses affected by COVID-19 backed by 16 Regional Credit Guarantee Foundations across the nation.
- The financial assistance for small business owners is provided mostly in connection with guarantees of the Regional Credit Guarantee Foundations. As a recent surge in the demand produced bottlenecks in some foundations, it was decided to review guarantees executed by each regional foundation through a Central Disaster and Safety Countermeasure Headquarters meeting on a weekly basis.
- As of 00:00, March 27, the number of consultations conducted and applications submitted to seek guarantees stood at a total of 298,042 in all regional guarantee foundations.
- Among them, the letters of credit guarantee were issued to 134,401 applications (45.1%), and 96,928 cases saw their loans executed (Annex 1).
- The government also developed the “fast scheme on financial support execution for small businesses” on March 27 with contents of diversifying channels to meet small businesses’ demand for the funding assistance which was mainly centered on regional foundations so that it can also be covered by commercial banks and the Industrial Bank of Korea depending on their credit ratings.
- If this measure is well applied in the field, the Regional Credit

Guarantee Foundations are expected to execute the funds even faster.

- The authorities said they **plan to review the guarantees provided for small businesses on a regular basis for a while through the Central Disaster and Safety Countermeasure Headquarters meetings.**
